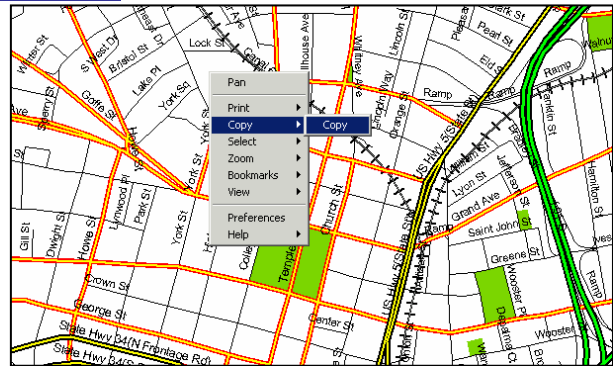


### Data Updates to CERC DataFinder®

Two weeks ago, all of the standard data supplied by Applied Geographic Systems was updated so that the current year estimates are for 2007 and the projections reach to 2012. The data from the 1990 and 2000 Censuses remain so that longer-term comparisons can be made.

### Q: How do I copy maps to use in other documents?

A: The easiest method is to right-click on the map and select 'Copy' as shown in the figure to the right. Next, open either Microsoft Word, Excel, Powerpoint or another file of your choosing and select 'Edit' and then 'Paste.'

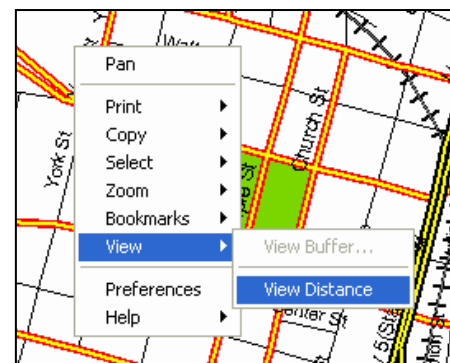


You can also use the 'Print Screen' key on your keyboard, but the following steps are not outlined in this newsletter because each computer has a different series of steps.

### Q: How can I calculate distances?

A: To have DataFinder calculate the distance of a road on the map, right-click with the mouse, select "View" and then "View Distance." Your mouse arrow will then have a symbol next to it that looks like: ►◄.

Move your mouse to the starting point on the map and left-click once. If you want to change the direction of the distance calculation at an intersection, just left-click once. A yellow box shows "Distance" (the length since your last left-click) and the "Total" (the total length since the beginning of the calculation). To end using this tool, simply double-click.
